Always check labels before bringing any materials into the toddler classroom for use by **ANY** child. While the room is not gluten free in totality (parents can send in gluten for meals), the materials we provide the room are. Be mindful and aware!

Art-

Gluten free Play-doh recipe:

1/2 cup rice flour
1/2 cup corn starch
1/2 cup salt
2 tsp cream of tartar
1 cup water
1 tsp cooking oil
food coloring

Put all ingredients in a cooking pan and cook on low heat, stirring constantly until a ball is formed. Remove from heat. When cool, pat until smooth. Store in a baggie.

- Oobleck (Cornstarch and water- it's a messy one but a fun way to explore solids and liquids)
